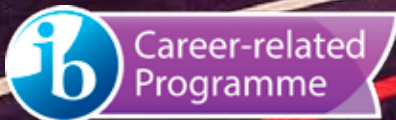
The Programme of Business Administration in Hospitality Management

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In 1994 Malmö Borgarskola started a new high school programme, which had not previously been administered here, the IB Diploma Programme. Now some twenty years later we have decided to start another new programme within the scope of the IB, the IB Career-related Programme of Business Administration in Hospitality Management (BAHM). This programme is based on the Swedish Business and Administration Programme (Handels- och Administrationsprogrammet).

## IB – the Gateway to Higher Education & the World

**A VOCATIONAL AND ACADEMIC PROGRAMME** leading to an IB Certificate, the IB is offered at more than 2,450 schools worldwide and the Career-related programme at some 120 schools.

**A RECOGNISED INDICATOR** of professional and academic excellence, the IB Certificate is awarded after examinations in the third year. The final transcript will contain IB courses and IB Core, Swedish national courses and courses from HIM. This is highly regarded by hotels and university admissions officers worldwide.

**ONE OF THE BIGGEST IB SCHOOLS IN SCANDINAVIA**, Malmö Borgarskola has taught the IB since 1994, with outstanding results.

**ONE OF THE WORLD'S BEST HOSPITALITY INSTITUTIONS, HIM**, is partnering us in this programme. Some parts of the course will be taught by teachers from SEG/HIM and all students will participate in a visit to SEG/HIM's beautiful campus in HIM/Montreux, Switzerland. There will also be scholarships for students to spend a longer period at SEG/HIM.

**OUR WORLD CLASS RESULTS** are due to our many years of experience and a combination of highly qualified teachers and strongly motivated students. Our staff members participate in regular professional development seminars organised by the International Baccalaureate Organisation and several have been appointed as examiners.

**OUR THREE YEAR PROGRAMME** is divided into a pre-IB year which is the equivalent of year 10 in international schools or year one in the Swedish gymnasium system followed by two IB Diploma years where class sizes are around 20.

## Partnership with Hotel Institute Montreux

**MALMÖ BORGARSKOLA IS** partnering with Hotel Institute Montreux (HIM), member of the Swiss Education Group (SEG) to ensure a top quality education. Hotel Institute Montreux, which is part of SEG, will conduct some of the teaching for this programme. The students will of course take part in a study trip to Switzerland to visit the Hotel Institute as part of the preparatory year. Throughout the entire course there will be close contact between Malmö Borgarskola and HIM. There will be a number of scholarships for students to conduct part of their training at the Hotel Institute Montreux.

## The Preparatory Year

**LAYING THE GROUND FOR YOUR FUTURE SUCCESS** The preparatory year is a one-year course prior to the actual IB BAHM Programme. Here students follow a course of study which is similar to the Business and Administration Programme in the Swedish system making it possible for students to change to another programme should they not wish to continue with the IB.

The aim of preparatory year is to prepare students for the challenge of the programme, developing their hospitality, academic and language skills, equipping them to study a broad range of subjects in English.

### SUBJECTS

- Entrepreneurship
- Information and Communication
- First language, Swedish or English
- Foreign language, English or Swedish
- Foreign language, French, German or Spanish
- History
- Social Sciences
- General Science
- Mathematics
- Physical Education/Activity

After the programme students will of course be eligible for university.

## What is the Programme of Business Administration in Hospitality Management (BAHM)?

**BAHM** is a programme that follows both the Career-related Programme of the IB and the Swedish Business and Administration Programme (Handels- och Administrationsprogrammet). The Career-related Programme is a framework of international education that incorporates the values of the IB into a unique programme addressing the needs of students engaged in career-related education.

The programme leads to further/higher education, apprenticeships or employment.

### THE BAHM CURRICULUM

BAHM students undertake a minimum of two IB Diploma Programme (DP) courses, a core consisting of four components and a career-related course.

For BAHM students, DP courses provide the theoretical underpinning and academic rigour of the programme; the career-related component further supports the programme's academic strength and provides practical, real-world approaches to learning; and the Career-related Programme core helps them to develop skills and competencies required for lifelong learning.

### ASSESSMENT AND EXAMS

Students take written examinations at the end of their IB Diploma Programme courses. These are marked by external IB examiners. The school assesses the components of the Career-related core.





## Pathway to employment

21st century life places complex demands on graduates looking for work – so enabling students to become self-confident, skilled and career-ready learners must be an integral part of their education.

The International Baccalaureate® (IB) Career-related Programme (BAHM) prepares students for the world of work, as well as developing a student's personal qualities.

By doing so it leads students down a personally chosen pathway towards further/higher education, apprenticeships or work.

### DEVELOPING STUDENTS FOR SUCCESS IN EMPLOYMENT

Students in the BAHM develop skills that are genuinely valued by employers. The programme's curriculum framework develops:

- linguistic proficiency
- critical thinking skills
- maturity and responsibility
- time management skills
- a strong work ethic
- social and communication skills.

These capabilities are complementary to the accredited skills students gain as a requirement of their career-related studies.

## Education UK

UK universities have an excellent reputation for providing a quality education recognised by employers around the world. This, in addition to the unique experience of student life in the UK, makes it a firm favourite for Scandinavian students wishing to study abroad.

We have a long tradition of preparing students for university studies in the UK with around 40 applicants each year. University admissions officers, with whom we have close contact, confirm the advantages of the IB Diploma; they know that its breadth and depth as well as emphasis on self discipline and planning give students an excellent basis for university studies. Past students report being very well prepared for the first year at university. Our Education UK centre is manned by Stuart Cameron and Lois Petersson, both from the UK and with many years' experience of university guidance. Students can get to know the universities as they visit us throughout the year.

At Malmö Borgarskola students will receive unique help with their applications and personal statements, including interview practice. We are also the test centre for the south of Sweden for the entrance tests to top institutions such as Oxford, Cambridge, UCL, LSE and various medical schools.

## Education USA

Our Education USA centre is part of a global network of more than 450 advisory centres supported by the US State Department. We offer accurate, comprehensive, objective and timely information about higher educational opportunities in the United States and provide specialist guidance to qualified individuals on how best to apply. During the year we are visited by a number of the universities, so students will have a chance to get to know them. The centre is staffed by our two professional advisors, Andreas Henninger and Carol Lundgren, who have extensive experience in placing our students.

Malmö Borgarskola welcomes international applications. You are invited to apply directly to the school by downloading the application form from our website and mailing it to us. Please be sure to include documentation from your current school and send the application to the address below. The application should ideally have reached us by February 1st for admission in August the same year. After receipt of the application you will be invited to sit entrance tests in Mathematics, English and perhaps in one or two additional subjects plus an interview.

- *Nine years of school (corresponding to 9th Grade of Swedish Comprehensive School)*
- *Good written and spoken English*
- *Passing test results in Mathematics and English*
- *Interview*

### Admission directly to second year:

- *Completed education from the 10th grade in international schools*
- *Good written and spoken English*
- *Passing test results in Mathematics, English and additional subjects.*
- *Interview*
